I want to solicit, from all the MVRC members, information regarding their usage of the clubs 147.00 MHz repeater. In my case, I get tired very quickly of the endless chatter by non-club members. I routinely change frequencies or turn my radio off. I'm under the impression that very few if any members actually use the repeater on a regular basis, if at all, as it currently stands. I have proposed to several club members the idea of changing the MVRC repeater over to a D-Star digital repeater. While the intention is not to put up a closed repeater, the intention is to reclaim the repeater for club use. By requiring a radio that is 3 to 4 times the cost of an analog FM radio, this should significantly reduce the number of random users on the system. However, I don't want to exclude current members from the repeaters if purchasing a new radio will be difficult. I realize that in today's economy budgets are tight.

As for paying for the new equipment, ICOM has a program to get a repeater for little or nothing. But the offer is ending soon so time is of the essence.


